

2010 Newberry Ag Expo Dairy Show

General Rules & Regulations

1. Only 4-H and FFA members who reside in South Carolina and are between the ages of 5 and 20 as of January 1, 2010 will be able to participate.
2. Purebred cattle must be registered with their National Breed Association. Registration Papers must be in the name of the exhibitor. Signed affidavits must be present if the animal is not in the juniors' name.
3. Exhibitors must provide food and water for their animal exhibits and keep their animals and area clean and presentable at all times.
4. All cattle must be in place by **5:00 pm**. Animals will be released after the completion of the show. There will be no removal of animals while the shows are in progress. Any exhibitor removing animals without official release or before release time forfeits all prize monies or awards they have won.
5. Any exhibitor using abusive or excessive force with their animal will be asked to leave the fairground and forfeit any premium money.
6. Bedding is provided.
7. Following the show, please clean tack and stall area and move bedding to specified locations. Failure to clean stall area will result in forfeiture of premiums.
8. Showmanship classes will be shown with all breeds combined. Showmanship Ages determined as age on 1/1/10.
9. Exhibitors must show their own animal in the showmanship class.
10. Conformation classes will be divided by breed. All Guernsey classes will show first, followed by Jersey and Holstein classes.
11. **Please have entry forms to Newberry County Ag Expo Dairy Show, PO Box 1136, Newberry SC 29108 no later than Monday, September 13, 2010.**
12. There will be an entry fee of \$5.00 per class. Make checks payable to Newberry Ag. Expo. Assoc.
13. *******NEW RULE*******
If any Junior Dairy exhibitor enters multiple animals in the Junior Dairy Show, he/she must show at least one (1) entry in each class in which they have animals entered. Junior exhibitors may enter multiple animals in any Junior Dairy Show class (except showmanship classes) but each animal must be shown by a Junior exhibitor.

Health Requirements

1. All cattle should be free of any signs of infectious or contagious diseases.
2. It is strongly encouraged that all cattle should be vaccinated for respiratory disease (shipping fever), specifically IBR, PI3, BRSV, and Pasteurella not sooner than 6 months and not less than 2 weeks prior to the show.
